Hazardous Dumping on VDM Property *Fines for Illegal Dumping*

Recently our staff has noticed illegal dumping on Villa Del Mar HOA

property. They have found cooking oil, motor oil, paint and charcoal to name a few. Not only is this a violation of the associations rules it is also illegal. These violations will carry a fine if reported.

These items can be harmful to wildlife and domestic pets. Hazardous products can get into and clog sewer lines as well as get into our drainage systems that flow to the ocean.

Although EJ Harrison does not have a specific collection process, they have informed us that residents may contain reasonablly small amounts of cooking oils in sealed bags or containers and put in the regular trash.

Each occurrence of a resident who doesn't pick up after their pet may be fined up to **\$500.00** per occurrence

your pet. Be kind to other residents and don't take large quantities of bags, leave bags for others. Thank you for your help and cooperation.

When Your Gas is Off No Gas-What Should You Do?

In light of our risk of earthquakes in Southern California, we installed

emergency gas shut-off valves on your gas meter located at the end of the building. Note that not all building have gas, some are electric only.

Sometimes the gas shut-off valve can be tripped by construction work,

landscaping activities or any major jolt. If your gas is off, you should try calling the office first. We will send a crew member by to check on the emergency shut-off valve. If it is after hours you may call our emergency phone at (805) 220-0173.

The emergency gas shut-off valves are meant to shut off in the case of an earthquake 5.4 magnitude or greater. This was done to prevent fire breakouts. In a major earthquake, fires cause the most amount of property damage.

If you call the gas company for this outage issue, they will charge a hefty service fee to come out and fix. This is a simple reset. Go to the gas meters at the end of the building and look for a red dot on the top of the earthquake valves. You may need to cover with your hand and use a light. Use a flat screwdriver and ¼ turn and the dot will turn green. If this doesn't resolve the problem or if you smell gas, then call the gas company.
